- 2) Called to order: 5:37 p.m.
- 3) Non-Agenda Public Comment
 - Fillipi's would like to get more involved, CMO David Rodger, attended on behalf of the business.
 - From Katie – want an update AB413, there is more space needed if you park near a crosswalk. We want clarification on that for PB. Krystal will take back guidance to bring to this community group.
 - From Katie – On march 27th, there is a meeting on mobility hosted by the city at the Taylor Library
 - San Diego Leprechaun Run is this weekend, March 16th
 - There will be a bike anywhere day in May; consider committee and businesses contributing to an activation to support the biking day
- 4) Grand Avenue Request to change white zone to 15 min parking – Claudia
 - a. Motion to approve the request made by J. Terrell, seconded by G. Daunoras. Motion approved unanimously.
- 5) Garnet Avenue & Everts Curb Extensions (Info Item) – Claudia Brizuela, City of San Diego
 - Grocery Outlet coming to Crunch location on the 1200 block.
 - They are requesting a commercial loading zone on the east side of Everts on the corner of Everts and Garnet.
 - We are interested in more information on what types of trucks are requesting this change.
 - Trader Joe's was able to operate there for years.
- 6) Hornblend Street Request for 3-minute passenger loading zone + 30 Minute Short Term Parking at 1721 Hornblend Street. – Claudia Brizuela, City of San Diego
 - Request for the curb extensions for seniors that are picked up from this corner.
 - Table to continue to next month to have the church explain their request.
- 7) Update on Parking Meter Pilot Program (Info Item) – Krystal Ayala, City of San Diego
 - If someone parks with a handicap placard, it shows that it was not parked without transaction. Will work with a consultant on how to review this.
 - Reviewed financial breakdown: City recovers annual costs to manage meters. From there, 55% is toward the city for administration and 45% goes to the community.
 - Initial budget was drafted, and an updated budget will be provided to the committee next month.

- Consider doing a review of the meter's metrics during the Summer.

8) Update on Beach Bug Shuttle (Info Item) – Krystal Ayala, City of San Diego

- We will want to review budget/revenue to understand how sustainable the Beach Bug Shuttle will be.
- Will review the ridership as we will consider cutting the number vehicles to meet needs.

9) PB Pathways AdHoc Committee Update – Katie Matchett

- Reviewing current pathways and reaching out to the community on the boardwalk
- Come up with a set of priorities along these pathways in the coming months or consider space coming with AB413.
- From set of recommendations, bring back to parking committee to review.
- Considering last Monday of each month from 6-7:30p
- Also new potential law, AB43: allows speed limits to be set not just on how fast vehicles typically drive on the street. Many pathways are in these districts, and this could lower those speed limits in those areas.
